Town Hall
The clock is the oldest working town hall clock in England

The Buthay
The name of this street derives from "The Butts" - the archery shooting field for the village. The Welsh & Blacks met here for their march to Agincourt

ROC Post
This Royal Observation Corp post was used in WW2 to spot enemy aircraft raiding Yate, Bristol & the train tunnel through Wickwar

Air Shaft
This is one of 7 airshafts under the village venting the railway tunnel that runs underneath

Remembrance bench
This bench commemorates the 75th anniversary of VE Day

Potteries
Heavy clay was quarried here & used in the pottery works that were located across this area

7

Newt Pond
This forms part of a developing nature reserve area and has recently been enlarged to increase its value to wildlife

The Bathers Quarry
This area was quarried during the construction of the Wickwar rail tunnel

9

The Stank
This is the name of the raised path that leads to the church. It was formerly a dam which held back the water of the village pond to the west
